### BOTTLES & CANS:

- Aluminum Containers
- Glass Containers
- Plastic Containers (#1 & #2)
- Tin/Steel Containers

Place the listed items in the commingled containers located in the lunch room, teachers' lounge or other designated areas around the school.



### CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

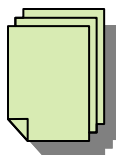
Flatten boxes and stack them neatly next to your mixed paper bin.

### MIXED PAPER



- Colored Paper
- Computer Paper
- Copy paper
- Envelopes
- Glossy Inserts
- Junk Mail
- Magazines
- Office Paper
- Scrap Paper

Place in the mixed paper container located in the classroom, offices, copy room, or library.

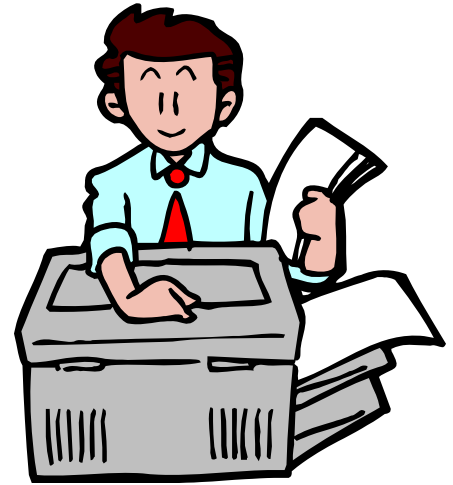

# Tips to Reduce Waste

## REDUCING WASTE AT YOUR WORKPLACE

- ◆ Make double-sided copies.
- ◆ Reuse file folders instead of discarding them.
- ◆ Remove your office from unwanted mailing lists.
- ◆ Edit documents on the computer before printing.
- ◆ Use ceramic or plastic mugs instead of disposable cups.
- ◆ Circulate information rather than making each employee a copy.
- ◆ Reuse the blank side of scrap paper to print drafts of letters, reports, etc.
- ◆ Email items instead of printing hard copies.



## REDUCING WASTE AT YOUR HOME

- ◆ When buying products, choose the one with the least amount of unnecessary packaging and buy in bulk.
- ◆ Join freecycle ([www.freecycle.org](http://www.freecycle.org)) and donate your unwanted goods.
- ◆ Reuse shopping bags or bring your own cloth tote bags to the grocery store.
- ◆ Avoid disposables (e.g. plastic utensils, paper plates, disposable razors)
- ◆ “Cut it and Leave it” - Leave your grass clippings on the lawn which makes less waste and also provides valuable nutrients for your lawn.
- ◆ Set up a backyard compost pile. The resulting compost can be used to fertilize your garden. Call us at 732-745-4170 if you are interested in purchasing a compost bin.
